A COMMUNITY MOURNS A GREAT LOSS

On September 1, 2009 life for many changed forever. On that date, just a bare month ago, Georgetown lost one of its own. Chad E. Spicer, a devoted father, beloved son, brother and friend, and committed police officer for the Georgetown Police Department was killed in the line of duty. In that moment, a community was sent reeling. In a flash, a community's sense of security and safety was stripped bare, and the reality of life's dark side parked itself on everyone's doorstep. The age of innocence for Georgetown had passed.

In spite of its deep despair, or perhaps because of it, the Georgetown community quickly rallied, and as you would expect, the outpouring of love and support for the Spicer family, for Chad's injured partner, Cpl. Shawn Brittingham, for the Georgetown PD, and for everyone who mourned, was overwhelming. La Esperanza, with the First State Community Action Agency, the Town and Georgetown PD, orchestrated the loveliest of candlelight vigils, which attracted all segments of a hurting society; A 'black ribbon brigade' tirelessly made thousands of lapel pins fashioned with Chad's photo for the vigil and funeral; And a close friend's mother lovingly made sandwiches in the early morning hours, to help feed the hundreds of officers who would be attending the memorials. People did anything and everything to help ease their own pain and the pain of their community.

The impact of the loss of Chad's life on people's lives cannot be calculated, and the depth of grief felt by so many, is immeasurable. It is hard to know when mourning will mingle with healing-for some it will seem an eternity. But the Town of Georgetown has shown its true strength and spirit while suffering this great loss; and though it has been forever altered by the events of Sept. 1st, Georgetown will continue to embrace community life which, along with the celebrating of its great joys, means the sharing of its great sorrows.

THE WORKSHOP WILL INCLUDE: 12 informational stations with specific information about construction of the bridge including, the design-build process, pile driving and concrete, pylon forms including reinforced steel, the falsework structure, the cable stay erection system, the traveler, the approach spans, and the final features of the bridge and their function. Many of these informational stations will include visuals highlighting the different elements of bridge construction.

Representatives from the University of Delaware will also be on site to discuss the monitoring capabilities of the new bridge. Information will be available about roadway approaches and park improvements. Several bridge designers, engineers and specialists will be on hand to explain the bridge's construction.

CONSTRUCTION SITE TOUR: At the final station, individuals have the opportunity to board a trolley and take part in a guided and narrated tour of the construction site.

WRITTEN COMMENTS: There will be an opportunity to provide written comments on the bridge construction project. Comments will be received during the workshop or can be mailed before October 30, 2009 to DeIDOT Public Relations, P. O. Box 778, Dover, DE 19903.

SPECIAL NEEDS: The location of this event is accessible to persons having disabilities. Any person having special needs or requiring special aid, such as an interpreter for the hearing impaired, is requested to contact DeIDOT by phone or mail one week in advance of October 17, 2009. 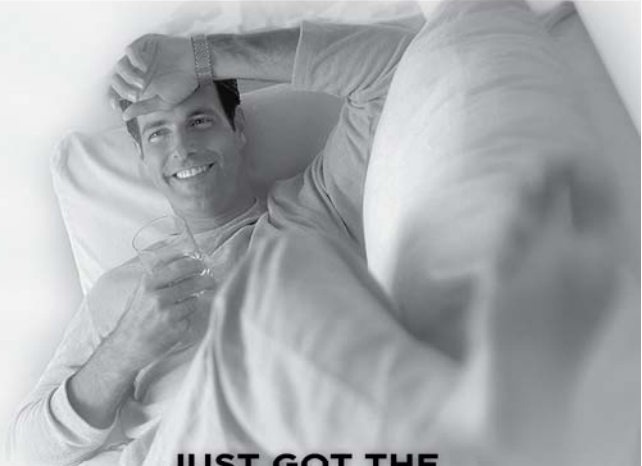

Local Program Celebrates Older Workers

While some employees complain about lack of job support and appreciation, two local seniors received deserving recognition of their hard work. Anna Donaway and Patti Miller are participants of the Senior Community Service Employment Program or SCSEP and the two seasoned workers were honored at a celebration event last month at the Chandler Heights Community Center in Seaford.

The event commemorated **National Employ Older Workers Week—September 20-26, 2009**—a national effort which recognizes the vital role of older workers in the workforce and showcases senior employment programs like SCSEP.



“It’s time we celebrate and appreciate our older workers,” said Roy Hazzard, Program Manager of the SCSEP, administered by First State Community Action Agency. “They are an important asset to our communities and workforce.”

According to the Department of Labor, older workers are the fastest growing sector of the American workforce. Employers who leverage the skills, work ethic, and maturity of this talent pool will reap big benefits.

SCSEP, a program funded by U.S. Department of Labor and Delaware Department of Health and Social Services, provides employment training and work experience for persons 55 years or older with limited financial resources. The primary goal of program is to transition qualified participants into the unsubsidized workforce where compensation is generally greater. In Delaware the program has trained over 5000 elderly persons since its inception in 1965. Hazzard states, “SCSEP provides employers with trained, motivated, older workers who, because of age, demonstrate talent, responsibility, wisdom and experience. Every year we make it our point to recognize these individuals.”

SUSSEX TECH DISHES UP HEALTHY DISHES

Students at Sussex Technical High School now have another option for a delicious – and healthy – lunch at school. In the school’s new salad bar, students are filling their plates with lettuce and piling on the cucumbers, radishes, chick peas, tomatoes, beets, cauliflower, broccoli, and several other vegetable choices that help maintain a healthy diet. Then for dessert, there is fresh, local-grown watermelon or Columbo soft, frozen yogurt.


Sussex Tech’s effort to promote a healthy school environment supports the Nemours 5-2-1 *Almost None* healthy eating campaign. In Delaware, about 85 percent of students reported that they did not eat five servings of fruits and vegetables a day. According to the Nemours website, fruits and vegetables are an important part of a growing child’s healthy diet. Most fruits and vegetables are full of nutrients and naturally low in calories and fat, making them a healthy choice any time.

The healthy food choices at Sussex Tech also help the local economy. Nemours has connected the school with local farmers who have provided fresh fruits and vegetables when possible. “We have been able to serve fresh corn on the cob that was picked and delivered in the morning, then husked, cooked and eaten for lunch at noon,” said Gary Woody, Sussex Tech’s cafeteria manager. The salad bar is offered for the same price as the other school entrée lunches.

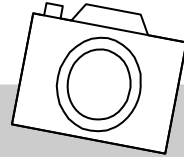
